Next Sunday our congregation will be celebrating the Lord's Supper. This week as we personally consider, "Am I ready to take the Lord's Supper in faith" there are questions that are important for each of us to answer:

- Have I confessed my sin to God and do I trust Jesus as the only One who can save me from it?
- Am I eager to obey Jesus and let Him be my Lord?
- Have I sought forgiveness and reconciliation from those I have wronged?
- Have I forgiven and reconciled with those who have wronged me?

SCRIPTURE: Acts 16

SUMMARY: Today is our final sermon in the ACTS series! To wrap it up, we will look at Acts 16, focusing on the section describing Paul and Silas' interaction with a jailer.

As we discuss this passage, here is an outline for us:

1. Paul and Silas are put in prison.
2. A violent earthquake takes place.
3. The jailer does not take his own life.
4. The jailer asks, "What must I do to be saved?"
5. Paul and Silas share the "word of the Lord" with the jailer and his family.

From this outline, I'd like to challenge you to hear from the Holy Spirit and get curious about answering some of these questions:

1. Why are Paul and Silas in jail?
2. Why would Paul and Silas STAY in jail?
3. How was the earthquake a good thing for the jailer?
4. How would you answer, "What must I do to be saved?"
5. What do you see as the difference between Jesus Christ as your Savior and Jesus Christ as your Lord?

Maybe the Holy Spirit is tapping you on the shoulder to try some of these things:

1. Read through Acts AGAIN, or maybe for the first time! Look closely for words or phrases that stick out to you.
2. Get signed up for a "LOVE DOES" small group study to put the love of Christ into ACTION, just as the early church was doing!
3. In your prayer time, think through what it means to have Jesus as your Savior and then think through what it means to have Jesus as your Lord.
4. Write down your answer to the question, "What must I do to be saved?"
