# **TEACHER:** Pastor Garry Nyenhuis

### **SCRIPTURE:** Acts 15

SUMMARY: This week we look at Acts 15, the early church's Council at Jerusalem.

### As we look at this passage, think through some of these things with me this morning:

1. What do the disciples identify as the key issue in the conflict?

- 2. Why do you think this is so important to them?
- 3. What is Peter's role in the discussion? Paul and Barnabas'? James'? 4. What does the letter consist of? Why these things?

5. What does this Council at Jerusalem teach us about conflict? Why would the disagreement between Paul and Barnabas be written about right after the Council?

#### Knowing the necessity of the Council at Jerusalem, what does it have to do with us today? Of course there are some principles about dealing with conflict, but how can we see application opportunities from a passage like this? What if...

1. ...you had to decide if something was a "salvation issue" to you? What do you list as "salvation issues?" Asked another way, what do you believe is worth getting into conflict over?

2. ...you had to decipher if the Holy Spirit was working in someone or in something? What evidences would you look to in order to be sure that God is present and active?

3. ...you needed to communicate with someone who you didn't agree with? What would you say or not say?

4. ...you were able to give your explanation of grace in 30 seconds? In three minutes? In thirty minutes?

Father, Son and Holy Spirit, give us the grace we need to see how You worked in the early church disputes. Give us grace to see that You don't stop working! We rely on You to see Your truth in this passage!

Stewardship Team Update - Thank you for your generous giving for the ministries of Living Water Community Church. Here are a few highlights based off the August 31, 2019 financial statements:

Revenue & Disbursements Update - For the first two months of this fiscal year (July – August) we currently have a shortfall of (-\$4,379.61).

- Total Revenue / Income = \$57,644.92
- Total Disbursements / Expenses = \$62,024.53
- Net Increase / (Decrease) = (-\$4,379.61)

LW Cash-Flow Update - The Living Water accounts at Northwestern Bank had a balance of **\$66,372.92** on August 31, 2019.

- It costs LWCC approximately **\$1,050** to operate on a daily basis.
- With our cash balances, we have about 63 days of operating money. .
- . The Stewardship Team has a goal of getting up to greater than 75 days of operating cash.

Building Debt Update - We currently have one loan to the Sheldon Christian School Foundation for \$100,000. Our debt to equity (the amount of debt based on the market value of our two campuses) is very strong. We are very healthy from a debt perspective.

**GRACE Update** - Our GRACE/Fair Share obligation for the last school year (July 2018- June 2019) was \$104,545.00 (55 Students).

- As of August 31, 2019 we have paid the schools **\$104,545.00 or** 100%.
- ٠ We will be receiving the updated requested amounts for this school year (2019-20) later this month from the area Christian schools.
